

ORDINANCE NO. 24-949

AN ORDINANCE TO WAIVE THE COMPETITIVE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 2023 CHEVROLET TAHOE VEHICLE FOR CCU

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Clarksville, Arkansas, desires to approve Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase a 2023 Chevrolet Tahoe vehicle.

WHEREAS, the requirements of competitive bidding are neither practical nor feasible; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized and empowered under the provisions of Arkansas Code Annotated Section 14-58-303(b)(1)(B) to waive competitive bidding requirements in situations where such process is not practical or feasible; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the city of Clarksville, Arkansas:

SECTION 1. The City hereby finds that competitive bidding is neither feasible nor practical in the current circumstance of the purchase of the above referenced vehicle due to said vehicle not being available under the State bid system and the supply of said vehicles being limited in distribution from the manufacturer to dealerships.

SECTION 2. Under the authority of Arkansas Code Annotated 14-58-303(b)(1)(B), the City does hereby waive competitive bidding requirements in connection with the purchase of a 2023 Chevrolet Tahoe vehicle.


SECTION 3. The City hereby approves the expenditure, not to exceed \$41,000.00, payable to George Nunnally Chevrolet, Inc. for the purchase of a 2023 Chevrolet Tahoe vehicle, to be paid for by Clarksville Connected Utilities.

SECTION 4. All ordinances, resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be retroactive to September 18, 2023.


SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE: This ordinance being necessary to secure a 2023 Chevrolet Tahoe vehicle which is in limited supply; and two of which are being held by George Nunnally Chevrolet, Inc. for Clarksville Connected Utilities until September 19, 2023 and, for the effective operation of Clarksville Connected Utilities and to aid in ensuring the public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of Clarksville, an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.
